In the beginning of February, demonstrations broke out across Haiti. For two weeks, groups of protestors blocked roads and major thoroughfares with tires and debris. They also gathered in key areas to protest the government and President Jovenel Moïse. Even thought these protests were localized, they paralyzed the country and caused schools and businesses to temporarily close.

Throughout this time we kept in contact with our pastors and school principals. Thank the Lord, everyone is fine. These protests are an expression of the frustration that everyone in Haiti is feeling. Rising prices and the difficulties of daily life reached a boiling point last month. President Moïse is working to provide an economic and political solution to Haiti's age old problems, but the task is overwhelming.

We believe that there is a spiritual solution. Boys and girls who are getting saved and receiving a Christian education will become the decision makers of the future in Haiti. When you sponsor a child, you become a part of the solution that Haiti needs.

Over the past several months, we have repaired six wells at the schools, the campus clinic and the local community. The wells became dry so new and deeper wells were needed. Boss Chrisner and his men used the shafts from a drilling rig to drill these wells by hand. They were able to drill as deep as 70 feet. These wells are helping many families. Your continued support will help keep these wells repaired.
